POLICY BULLETIN NO. 503**

SUBJECT: SINGLE PHASE SERVICE TO A MOBILE HOME

POLICY:

The cooperative will make single-phase electric service available to mobile homes in its service area in accordance with its by-laws and under the following terms and conditions:

A. GENERAL CONDITIONS

The member will furnish

1. A \$50.00 non-refundable new service fee
2. A security deposit (if required) (See Policy 104)
3. All necessary easements
4. Cleared right-of-ways

B. OVERHEAD SERVICE

1. The member will furnish
 - a. A meter loop - constructed in accordance with the cooperative's specifications
 - b. A non-refundable aid-in-construction payment equal to 75% of the actual construction cost per circuit foot of primary line or secondary line.
2. Where it is determined on the basis of good engineering practice that service can be taken from an existing pole and the member wishes a meter pole set for his convenience, he shall pay a non-refundable aid-in-construction payment of \$150.00.

C. UNDERGROUND SERVICE – PRIMARY AND SECONDARY VOLTAGES

The member will furnish a non-refundable aid-in-construction payment equal to 75% of the actual construction cost per circuit foot of primary line or secondary line.

The cooperative will make no primary line extensions of less than 100 circuit feet.

D. CONVERTING EXISTING OVERHEAD LINE TO UNDERGROUND

The member shall pay the total estimated costs for labor and material for the converting of an existing overhead line to underground. Each job shall be estimated on an individual basis and charges may be reduced in those instances where converting to underground may eliminate future tree trimming costs.

E. QUALIFICATIONS FOR PERMANENT STATUS

The cooperative will declare a mobile home a permanent residence if an inspection of the premises determines that the following improvements have been made.

1. The mobile home is blocked up and the wheels have been removed.
2. An approved septic system has been installed.
3. A permanent water supply has been provided and plumbed into the mobile home.

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F. CONSTRUCTION CHARGES

1. All charges must be paid prior to the start of construction.
2. All charges are based on anticipated normal construction conditions. The cooperative reserves the right to increase charges should conditions be encountered that would substantially increase the cost of construction. The cooperative also reserves the right to decline an application for service or alter the route of a line if natural conditions are such that the cooperative determines that construction is not feasible.
3. All charges for new construction are based on the assumption that the member will begin installation of his mobile home as soon as the electric service is made available. If, in the judgment of the cooperative, there is some question as to when installation may begin, the member may be required to pay an additional security deposit. The amount of such deposit shall be determined on a case by case basis and shall be refundable in full at such time as the mobile home is installed
